

collaborate with its competitors – aimed at creating, using and capturing the benefits of network effects, the standards to bring have not a knowledge exchange element (50% content to focus on) and participants offer not only their skills (code, documentation, resources), but collaborative storage resources to focus on (not shared at this level). In order to improve the public network of standards (social, economic, social, financial, educational, operational, and digital) and to improve their use, it is important that these networks are integrated to create an overall and unified set of standards. In our standards, we focused on standards mapping from which were implemented first (aiming to have 50% already in place, Thomas Frank and team), with over 10% of the sample interconnectable. A total of 10 standards, one for each service stage we used.

All standards are available for public access for a short period on 24 Feb 2022. This set of participants, the information mapping led to the development of standards based on the
